This is Not a Drill by Benjamin M. Weilert is an educational picture book that invites young readers to help Robbie Robin rebuild his home after a storm. The story starts by

introducing Robbie, a little bird whose cozy nest was blown away by a storm. Kids are encouraged to help Robbie build a brand-new birdhouse. As the journey unfolds, children are introduced to various handy tools, such as safety glasses, measuring tapes, saws, sanders, hammers, wood glue, clamps, and of course, a drill. Each tool is accompanied by the question "Is this a drill?", making it a fantastic resource for curious minds. The next page reveals what the tool is and explains how it works, keeping the learning fun and interactive. Once Robbie's new home is built, the author takes a moment to recap all the tools used along the way. The easy-to-follow steps mean parents can turn this story into a hands-on project, creating wonderful bonding moments together.

What I loved about Benjamin M. Weilert's storytelling is how he uses repetition and illustrations to engage children while teaching them valuable technical skills. The narrative is simple yet effective, and the thoughtful inclusion of safety tips throughout the story adds a nice touch. The pacing is just right, allowing little readers to absorb each concept without feeling rushed. While the book leans more toward instructional content than a traditional story, it truly shines in making learning enjoyable and interactive. Through repetition and visual aids, the book helps children identify various tools and understand their specific uses. The story of Robbie needing a new home promotes empathy while introducing the idea that tools can help us solve problems and lend a helping hand. This is Not a Drill is a wonderfully designed educational tale that successfully introduces young children to basic tools and construction concepts in a friendly and engaging way."
